ELA News from Mrs. Wright



Literature Classes:

Book talks, myths, folklore, short stories, and novels... oh my! Students have been immersed in all kinds of rich literature these past few weeks. Among the beginning of the year's book talk projects we have been working on defining our roles as readers and how to connect and dissect what we are reading. It is great to share my love of reading with your children!



Writing Seminar:

Students are busy reviewing their knowledge of the parts of speech and how they function in writing. Students have also been practicing their email writing skills with writing an email to Mr. Bennett, in regards to ideas for indoor recess and also to me, Mrs. Wright, on a place they would love to visit someday.

STEAM

The Advanced STEAM class is working on creating a wood duck birdhouse. The students are following the engineering process, which includes: identify the need or problem; research the need or problem; brainstorm; select the best possible solution; construct a prototype; test and evaluate the solution; communicate the solution with the customer; redesign and build. The students needed to talk to the customer, Ms. Tilmon, and determine what she wanted. They needed to research online the dimensions of the birdhouse, the location, and other factors. They had to design the birdhouse. We are at the prototype phase, where the students are constructing a prototype in cardboard.

STEAM foundations class is working on designing and constructing a rubber band race car. They needed to do research; decide on the steps involved; construct the car; resolve the problems and reevaluate the design; fix or redo the model. We are close to finishing!

Photography class is learning about the Exposure Triangle: aperture priority, ISO, and shutter priority. The students have taken pictures using aperture priority alone, and setting aperture and ISO using the school's Nikon D90. During one of the classes, we went outside and shot flowers and the birdhouse. Next, the students will learn how to shoot in shutter priority and how to stop motion or slow motion.

Video editing class has learned how to do paper slide videos and flip-grid videos. These are two ways of creating a quick report for school in video format. We recently created whiteboard videos and are now learning how to edit them in WeVideo, an online video editing program for which TCS purchased a yearly subscription.

Intro to Coding is finishing Unit 1, problem solving. Before you can learn how to code, you need to understand about input, output, processing, and storage, as well as, how to problem solve because the code will go wrong, and you will need to fix it! Our next unit is on webpage design, HTML, and CSS.
