News from the Counselor

Hello TCS families! Some exciting news from the counseling department is that I am currently working with the TCS staff on developing and implementing a positive behavior recognition program for the students. We want to make sure we are recognizing our students when they do something positive!

I asked our staff members to give me 3-5 student behaviors they would like to see every student here at TCS exhibit or work on improving. After reviewing the responses from the staff, I tallied up the 5 most listed behaviors. These 5 behaviors are:

- acts of kindness
- self-control
- being respectful
- being responsible
- having a positive attitude

We developed a reward system for students who are exhibiting the target behaviors. These rewards range from school supplies to drinks and snacks. In addition to the rewards, teachers will complete certificates for the student that will be displayed on a bulletin board in school. Along with individual rewards, there will also be school-wide rewards students are able to work towards earning. For example, there will be a student versus staff kickball game later in the year when the weather gets warmer. We are hopeful that by recognizing the many positive behaviors of our students, we can help our students develop, improve and maintain wanted behaviors and shy away from the unwanted misbehaviors. The program will be rolling out next week, beginning on December 3rd.

Transitions Program - Marti Phillips, Coordinator

The Office of Vocational Rehabilitation's Early Reach Program continues to work with students in transition to help them develop skills for future employment and careers. We are having monthly workshops and our first

two involved self-awareness and communication skills. In December we are looking forward to a presentation on interview skills. Students in the upper grades have taken a field trip to Manor College in Jenkintown and one of our students will be going on a job shadowing experience. Looking ahead we plan to visit Delaware County Community College in January as we continue to explore and plan for life after high school. Video Editing

We are finishing our "Disaster" video editing project. We downloaded a video (with permission) from Discovery Education. We added a title, a logo, an introduction, and severely edited the video to between 30 seconds to 1 minute. We muted from the video clip, added music (with permission) from FreePlay Music, and added a voiceover for the movie, and finally, added credits to the end.

Advanced STEAM

This class is finishing our major project for the nature center. We've created two Wood Duck bird houses. We started with the concept; interviewed our "client," Miss Tilmon; researched the bird, types of wood, and the blueprints for the house; calculated the amount of wood needed; and we took a field trip to Lowes in Exton. Mrs. Fredericks' husband cut the wood and drilled pilot holes. We assembled the bird houses and are finishing painting the outside of the birdhouses to protect them from the elements.





Cinema Class

Sophia and Romeo used their "Critics on a Stick" to review the 1935 horror movie, Mad Love. This was the fourth movie this fall. Their challenge was to defend different points of view about the movie.



Photography

The first marking period was centered on learning how to use a camera in different modes of shooting. This marking period's concentration is composition. The primary areas we'll cover are: "Rule of Thirds:" place points of interest on the intersections and important elements along the lines; Leading Lines: natural lines to lead eyes into the picture especially to an interesting subject; "Diagonals:" diagonal lines create great movement; "Framing:" use natural frames such as trees, or man-made such as windows and doors; "Fill the Frame:" Get close to your subjects; "Patterns and Repetition:" patterns, especially patterns in nature, are aesthetically pleasing, but the best is when the pattern is interrupted; "Symmetry:" both sides of image are the same. We've completed Rule of Thirds, and just started Leading Lines.









Intro to Coding

This class is continuing the focus on learning HTML coding for websites. The students are working on a personal website that includes three pages which are linked together. The pages have a navigation bar at the top; have two pictures with author credit and attributions; have ordered and unordered lists (numbers and bullets); and paragraphs. After this project, we will start CSS (Cascading Style Sheets) to make the pages aesthetically pleasing!

STEAM Foundations

We are continuing our exploration of circuits. We just finished paper circuits, where we use copper tape, LED lights, and watch batteries to create the circuit. The first part was a simple circuit, where the students created a picture, and added a light to one part of the picture. We took it a step further and created parallel circuits that lit up two eyes on a Thanksgiving picture. We currently are using Makey Makey circuit boards connected to our Chromebooks, and having different materials, such as Play Doh (conductive clay) act as the keyboard! Our next project with Makey Makey will be creating a DDR (Dance Dance Revolution) floor pads with cardboard and aluminium foil.
