# Reminder about the Canada Trip

TCS is planning a trip to Ontario, Canada for Spring Break. The trip will introduce students to a variety of sites in a region known as "The "Golden Horseshoe". #### A Lesson in Gratitude

The day before Thanksgiving break, I had the privilege of doing a presentation on gratitude for the entire school community. I screened a youth Ted Talk performed by a young man who, after narrowly avoiding a horrible car accident, had begun a journey to say "thank you" to one person a day for an entire year. He describes different people in his life that he thanked over the course of that year, some of whom were close family members, while others were friends or merely acquaintances of some kind. The one commonality between all of these people was that they all had impacted the young man positively in some way, however big or small.

The speaker mentioned that he used to wake up in the morning and find something to complain about, even prior to leaving his bed. Now, during this gratitude exercise, he woke up and asked himself, "Who am I going to thank today?" He revealed that this change in mindset positively impacted his attitude for the rest of the day. We discussed the implication of this as a group and agreed that the lesson is that what we choose to think about and where we choose to put our energy can dictate how our day goes. There will always be things to complain about, but there are also always things to be grateful for. Making the conscious choice to acknowledge what you are grateful for can go a long way in minimizing any anguish over what you think might be missing in your life.

I asked the group to think about one person they were grateful for and passed out rubber bands to wear as a symbol of that person. A few brave students shared and spoke about the people in their lives they were thankful for, which was wonderful. I encouraged everyone to make an effort to tell that person, if possible, that they were grateful for them. I hope they did. If not, it's not too late.

Showing gratitude should not just be a one-time-a-year event. The speaker in the video encouraged the audience to show gratitude daily, even for the smallest of polite gestures. I think we are all grateful to be a part of the TCS community. I know I am. Let's continue to show it and continue to tell those in our lives who support us, "Thank you."

<u>Intro to Coding</u> has finished HTML and CSS website programming. We've progressed to JavaScript, where we we've studied and practice coding with sprites, variables, randomizing, parameters, animation, counters, and loops.

<u>Circuits & Robotics</u> class is continuing with Scratch, an introductory programming language. We are creating a game so that we can use our Makey Makey controllers to operate the games. I can't wait to see what they accomplish!

<u>Game Design</u> just completed a complex space game! We had a player with enemies that attacked randomly, we gained points when we destroyed an enemy, and lost points when the enemy collided with us. We created a scoreboard that displayed both score and health.

<u>Chroma Key</u> (Green Screening) class is working on their current project that has a Halloween (or scary) theme. This time the students wrote their story in a Google doc, then completed a storyboard that showed each scene of the story. Next, we'll record the footage; upload into WeVideo, edit in WeVideo, and add music to the background.
